| <b>STRAWBERRIES</b>     | <b>Ripens</b> | <b>Variety Information</b>  |
|-------------------------|---------------|---|
| Hood                    | June 1        | Large glossy red berry with fine, sweet flavor. Excellent for preserves and jams.                                     |
| Benton                  | June 1        | Late season variety that has great flavor and sweetness if color is allowed to deepen.                                |
| Shuksan                 | June 1        | Large, bright red berry with medium firm flesh and great flavor. Excellent for fresh eating.                          |
| Rainier                 | June 5        | Bright red inside and out with excellent flavor. Similar to Hood with better keeping quality. Use fresh or preserved. |
| Marys Peak              | June 20       | Large berries with excellent firmness and flavor. A later June bearing variety with deep red color throughout.        |
| <b>RASPBERRIES</b>      | <b>Ripens</b> | <b>Variety Information</b>  |
| Cascade Dawn            | June 10       | Early season, flavorful red berry. Fine texture makes it perfect for fresh eating and desserts.                       |
| Meeker                  | June 20       | Medium red, slightly firm berries with good quality flavor. Fresh eating, freezing, canning.                          |
| Cascade Delight         | June 25       | Large, flavorful mid-season berry. Best for fresh eating or fresh desserts. Easy to pick.                             |
| Tulameen                | June 25       | Large, light red, aromatic berries with wonderful flavor. Late ripening variety.                                      |
| <b>FALL RASPBERRIES</b> | <b>Ripens</b> | <b>Variety Information</b>  |
| Caroline                | Aug 1         | Largest ever-bearing variety. Large, flavorful red fruit of excellent quality.  |
| <b>BLACKBERRIES</b>     | <b>Ripens</b> | <b>Variety Information</b>  |
| Silvan                  | June 20       | A cross between Marion & Boysenberry, with Marion flavor, but earlier ripening date.                                  |
| Obsidian                | June 20       | Large, early ripening variety with large fruit and excellent fresh fruit quality. Developed by OSU.                   |
| Kotata                  | July 1        | Looks like marion, but with firm, sweet-tart blackberry flavor. Excellent for jam and pie.                            |
| Marionberry             | July 1        | An Oregon original. Blackberry with rich, distinctive flavor. Excellent for jam and pie.                              |
| Boysenberry             | July 1        | Very large, soft, juicy berry with distinctive, tangy flavor and very aromatic.                                       |
| Triple Crown            | July 20       | Large, flavorful, thornless blackberry with sweet-tart flavor. Makes great milkshakes!                                |
| Chester                 | Aug 1         | Medium sized, roundish, deep black in color. Larger seeds, mild flavor, not too tart.                                 |
| <b>OTHER BERRIES</b>    | <b>Ripens</b> | <b>Variety Information</b>  |
| Tayberry                | June 20       | Cross of rasp and blackberry, from Scotland. Long, dark, red berry with unique flavor.                                |
| Currant (Red & Black)   | June 20       | High in antioxidants and Vitamin C. Sweet, tart flavor, used in jellies, syrup, sauces, liquers.                      |
| Gooseberry              | June 25       | Large, smooth-skinned green berries turn reddish when ripe. Used for pie, jam, tea, wine.                             |
| <b>BLUEBERRIES</b>      | <b>Ripens</b> | <b>Variety Information</b>  |
| Duke                    | June 25       | Med-large, firm, light blue berry with a mildly tart flavor. Stays fresh longer than most.                            |
| Bluecrop                | July 1        | Large, flavorful, light blue fruit good for fresh eating, baking, preserving and freezing.                            |
| Jersey                  | July 1        | Dark blue, very sweet berry. A favorite for baking.   |
